This chapter introduces the best patent and trade mark attorneys in France (CPI – Conseils en Propriété Industrielle) who are still part of a distinguished profession from their lawyer counterparts. The CPI firms advise inventors on protecting and exploiting their rights. There are about 828 experts who have the title of CPI. They are divided between engineers, who specialise in patents, and jurists, who deal with trade mark issues.

Cabinet Beau de Loménie fields a leading patent practice, the firm managing more than 55,000 patents and registering numerous patent rights in France and Europe. The department, led by Didier Intès, Jean-Jacques Joly, Gérard Portal and Philippe Hubert, is organised around four specialities; mechanics, electronics, chemistry and biology. Trade mark expertise is also high under Aurélia Marie and her team of 15 jurists, who manage around 61,000 trade marks and designs. The firm has some 60 CPI, and has offices in Paris, Lille, Lyon, Marseille, Munich and Duisburg.

Anticipating future market developments, Lavoix signed an agreement with law firm Lavoix Avocats, formerly Binn & Associés, in 2008 to create one of the few inter-professional networks between CPI and lawyers. The firm has in-depth expertise in biotechnology, pharmacy, chemistry, electronics, physics and new technologies. It has around 60 professionals, providing French and European advice on patents and trade marks with an active patent registration practice. The firm has offices in Paris, Lyon, Toulouse and Chamalières, and recently opened an office in Munich to bolster its activity at European level. The portfolio is drawn from large CAC 40 companies (Alstom, Arcelor, LVMH, Rhodia), foreign groups (Colgate, Richemont) and innovative start-ups.
